Workshop Description:

Mental & Behavioral Health Professionals throughout the United States are mandated reporters of suspected child maltreatment, and often required to report concerns for intimate partner violence and/or elder abuse. Legal requirements to report are often confusing to navigate, especially in relation to our other professional and ethical responsibilities. This course is intended for Clinicians who already have a basic understanding of their obligations as mandated reporters, and want to explore areas that are complicated by our professional relationships with clients across the lifespan in light of our legal obligations. Specifically, we will explore how our reporting obligations differ based on the social problem we are reporting about. Where do these legal obligations to report come from? And are they ethically appropriate?

Workshop Description:

Can social workers and mental health professionals work with clients that they know from outside of the job? Can you barter with clients for your services? Mental health professionals are charged with the legal and ethical responsibility to maintain professional boundaries, but the obligation isn't always so easy to discern. This course brings real-world context to ethical concerns often experienced by professionals in practice in maintaining appropriate professional boundaries. This course will provide a framework to contemplate ethical dilemmas and make informed decisions that insulate professionals from legal liability while protecting clients from harm.

Workshop Description:

Boderline Personality Disorder (BPD) impacts millions of Americans, yet remains under-studied and misunderstood. Although new research shows promising outcomes for people with BPD, structural stigma continues to negatively impact people who reach out for help. Consequences of structural stigma include increased cost of care, poor treatment outcomes, re-traumatization of vulnerable clients, and provider burnout. In this workshop, we will learn about promising new research on the long-term course of the diagnosis and what factors contribute most to recovery along with strategies to effectively engage with clients BPD at various levels of care, reducing provider burnout and improving treatment outcomes.
