What will happen if I stop focusing on eating behaviors with my clients who struggle with EDs? What would happen if I started seeing EDs as a symptom and not as the disease? Could the vicious and seemingly never-ending cycle of eating disorder recovery be stopped if we looked beyond the behaviors?

This is an introductory workshop that will explore traditional ED treatment approaches and offer a trauma informed "upgrade" - one that is based in the Auto-nomic Nervous System (ANS), Attachment theory, and current trauma treatment.

## Exploring Professional Responses to Child Neglect

### Workshop Description:

Workshop Description: Reports of suspected child neglect make up more than three-quarters of all reports made to child protective services in any given year; 6 times more than reports of sexual abuse, and 5 times more than reports of physical abuse. However, neglect reports are least likely to be substantiated after investigation. The substantiated after investigation. The reality is that reporters of suspected child maltreatment struggle with appropriately identifying and reporting this type of maltreatment. This session will explore the legal and ethical obligations of professional reporters, especially as they relate to the concept of child neglect. Various types of child neglect, including physical neglect, medical neglect and educational neglect will be explored, along with a significant conversation around parental supervision and the use of corporal punishment.

Workshop Description: Many clinicians understand that knowing something about drug and alcohol use dis-orders could be helpful when treating clients with mental health issues. In this foundational workshop you will learn Who, Why, What and How, in your approach to substance use.

WHO: Everyone you are treating (and YOU) are living in a world rife with substances, alcohol, and nicotine. It's not something to be pushed to the side. Most people who need treatment do not get it for many reasons; you can help change that. WHY you need to know about Substance that. WHY you need to know about Substance Use Disorders to be an effective clinician. WHAT you will miss in diagnosing and treating clients if you do not know the basics of Substance Use Disorders. WHY "I don't want to work with drug users" is not an acceptable statement in social work and how to become more comfortable in the field; HOW not to be afraid of asking questions; when to ask them and what kind of questions to ask; and HOW to discern between a mental health symptom and a substance use mental health symptom and a substance use disorder symptom. There will also be a discussion about drug categories and characteristics.
