This course will focus on the specific challenges of those who serve in the military and the response of social work practitioners to those challenges. We will explore the nature of war, its impact on those who are wounded - physically and mentally -- and the impact of the military experience on them and their loved ones/caregivers. Particular emphasis will detail the impact of the current wars in Iraq and Afghanistan on returning military, many suffering with PTSD, Traumatic Brain Injury and substance abuse problems. Additional areas of exploration include the challenges faced by women in the military, the wounded and those who contemplate suicide.

Workshop Description:

With the tides finally changing in the direction of acceptance of same-gender marriage, couples therapists are seeing an increase in the number of gay and lesbian couples seeking therapy. It might be logical for clinicians to see the treatment of same-gender couples as virtually the same as work with heterosexual couples. In this workshop, we will explore the treatment of same-gender female couples and the unique challenges and clinical issues. The tendency of both gay and straight clinicians to impose heterosexual norms on lesbian couples will be discussed. Participants will also gain specific tools and repertoire to more effectively provide couples therapy to same-gender females unions.
