Through an in-depth discussion and case illustrations, this workshop is designed to differentiate between trauma referred to with a capital "T" and the type of traumas referred to with a lower case "t". Attend-ees will learn how the Autonomic Nervous System (ANS) functions by defining specific symptoms and behaviors found in Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and Accumulated Stress Injury. Audience participation will be encouraged to enhance learning about the various implications of traumas and to reinforce an understanding of the impact of trauma on the brain and ANS. Mr. Keizerstein will demonstrate various approaches for effective treatment of symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder and accumulated stress injury.

Workshop Description:

Abandonment trauma and its aftermath of self-sabotaging patterns is the subject of this seminar. We delineate the key features of post-traumatic stress disorder of abandonment and explore how unre-solved abandonment trauma can interfere in adult functioning in the form of deeply entrenched automatic behaviors. The dilemma for practitioners is that it seems easier for people to gain emotional self-awareness than to *change behavior*. What is the resistance about? Do we deliberately resist changing our deeply entrenched patterns even when they are self-defeat-ing? Are other mechanisms within the brain at play? Is some part of what we do involuntary? How do we overcome them? This seminar explores techniques for ame-liorating the underlying emotions stemming from abandonment wounds past and pres-ent and for overcoming abandonment's post-traumatic patterns of self sabotage.

Many caregivers endure financial strain, depression and isolation, feelings of guilt that they need respite, as well as emotional and physical stress. Some caregivers find themselves thrust into crisis for immediate long-term care. This work-shop will identify the caregiver ecosystem, address the challenges and identify the signs of caregiver burnout. Tasks/duties for each phase of the caregiver journey and the needs and experiences of the caregiver will be discussed.
