Hoarding is a problem that affects millions of people and their families and impacts overall functioning. It is commonly stigmatized and as a result can be underreported because hoarders may be ashamed, have little control over their behavior, and often tend to isolate. This workshop will discuss hoarding as a prevalent disorder in our society and some of the common misconceptions that make it more difficult to manage and treat. A general overview along with tools and suggestions for working with people diagnosed with hoarding disorder will be discussed.
