About the Program

Front line workers provide critical services to our nation's seniors and individuals with disabilities. As one of the fastest growing occupational sectors in our nation, we must make meaningful investments to ensure that this field encourages retention, provides advancement opportunities and empowers those dedicated to caring for vulnerable members of our community.

Stony Brook University's Schools of Social Welfare and Nursing are now part of the Ladders to Value Workforce Investment Organization* (LTV WIO). Starting this month, SBU is launching a series of skill building educational workshops for the direct care workforce in the long-term care sector on Long Island. The LTV WIO will utilize innovative strategies through educational trainings to recruit, retain, and support direct care workers.

Who Should Attend

The trainings specifically target the direct care workforce including CNAs, LPNs, RNs, Care Managers, OT & PT Assistants, Home Health Aids, and BSWs, as well as a range of administrative staff with direct patient contact.

When

We are offering ½ day classroom-based workshops. In the future these staff development opportunities will also include live webinars and online self-study programs. The courses are free for long term care employees. To encourage participation, organizations that employ an individual attending a 4-hour session may submit documentation of eligibility to receive training incentive.

SUBJECT	COURSE DESCRIPTION
Caring for Patients with Dementia	Helping healthcare providers ensure patients living with dementia retain the highest possible quality of life
The Challenges of Co-Morbidity	Aiding individuals living with more than one illness or emotional disorder simultaneously
Communication Skills and Conflict Resolution	Working with people requires many different skills. Practice the skills needed to communicate effectively with patients and their families to enhance the relationships and avoid conflicts.
Trauma Informed Care with Veterans	Drawing from SAMSHA's guidelines for evidenced-based, trauma informed care, this workshop will provide practitioners with the concepts and tools needed for serving veterans and their families. Participants will have an opportunity to practice the skills needed to help those who have served our country.
Working with People from Different Backgrounds and Cultures	Cultural competence and linguistic sensitivity training to aid in serving individuals from varied backgrounds
