## Focus on: Field Education as the Signature Pedagogy

As part of the 2008 CSWE Education Policy and Accreditation Standards, Field Education was named the signature pedagogy of social work education. Being the signature pedagogy expresses recognition and value of what the field instructor offers and what the student gains through immersion with the client population, tasks assigned and the critical thinking and self reflection that gets processed during supervision. Signature pedagogy reflects "elements of instruction and of socialization that teach disciplinary novices to think, to perform, and to act with integrity to the discipline" (Shulman, 2005) ". . . these pedagogies encourage students to do, think, and value what practitioners in the field are doing, thinking and valuing, they disclose significant important information about the personality of a disciplinary field – its values, knowledge, and manner of thinking – almost, perhaps, its total world view" (Calder, 2006.) Clearly, we in field education play an essential role. As field instructors we appreciate what we have to offer and take the responsibility seriously. We all remember our field placements and our field instructors. We use these experiences to guide and focus our work with our students. It is heartening and empowering to know that field education is valued and celebrated.

**Field Education Facts:** As you know, as of January 2015 social workers are required to obtain continuing education contact hours to maintain their NYS social work license.
