

MSW Part-Time Requirements

Part-Time Program

This option is designed for students who choose not to follow the regular full-time schedule. Students must take the course as prescribed. Courses are limited to two per semester for a total of six (6) credits. After completion of the second year, students may register for more than six (6) credits. Part-Time students begin Practicum Education during the fall semester of their second year. The degree requirements are typically completed in three to four years, but must be completed within five (5) years of your date of entry.

Part-time students will enroll in Community Learning Day for a total of 4 semesters during their time in the program. These courses will be taken when a student is registered for their policy courses. Community Learning Day HWC 596a and HWC596b will be taken in the first year of the program. Community Learning Day HWC597a and HWC 597b will be taken when the student registers for advanced policy, which is usually in their third year of the program.

Part-Time students will develop a curriculum plan with their advisors to determine which semesters they will enroll in each required course.
