ORIGIN

In Fall 2016, the SSW Staff and Faculty developed the *BYOB Red Bag Lunch & Dinner Series* to provide an opportunity for BSW and MSW students to interact with peers, alumni, and University representatives. Through collaborative efforts and shared resources, SSW students will become acclimated to the campus culture; learn how to navigate their way through the University; increase their advocacy awareness and social justice efforts; utilize support services; and develop the skills needed to persist through to graduation and beyond.

During the Academic Year, September to May, students will attend educational workshops designed to assist with transitioning into the SSW and the University, building confidence, and fostering community.

Each *Red Bag Lunch & Dinner Series* is specifically designed to ensure student success.

- To provide transitional programming to entering transfers and students returning to school after more than five years after receiving their last degree;
- To enhance each participant's problem-solving, critical thinking, and study skills;
- To familiarize and connect students with available campus resources and support services;
- To provide students with personal, academic, financial and career advisement; and
- To provide a supportive environment.
